

- **Kevia Food Processing Factory** with the company founder Richard Regendo.
- **Tanzanian Coffee Research Institute** on the slopes of Mount Kilimanjaro.
- **DuduTech**, a leading biological IPM company headquartered near the shores of Kenya's Lake Naivasha and a leader in biological pest control in horticulture.
- **Export Trading Group (ETG)**, tour and meeting with senior management of their world class warehousing facility in the port of Dar es Salaam.
- **TPC Limited**, Tanzania's oldest and largest producer of sugarcane.
- **Clinton Foundation Demonstration Farm**, Iringa.
- **One Acre Fund**, an NGO that provides micro financing for agricultural inputs for small scale farmers.

Since its establishment in 1994 it has grown to be one of Zambia's largest agribusiness with an annual revenue of approximately US\$275 million.
